Now a Burlington resident, Mr. Herring has performed with the Burlington Choral Society. Post-COVID, Mr. Herring is looking forward to

singing in front of live audiences again and continuing to mentor future generations of young singers.

He is also doctoral student at Northeastern University investigating international student experiences through psychosocial and sociocultural needs. He is a highly dedicated Student Affairs Professional with nine years of experience across several universities ranging from small private liberal arts to mid-size flagship institutions.
